REQUIREMENTS UPON NOTIFICATION OF PROVISIONAL ADMISSION

Upon notification of provisional admission to the ASU BSN Program, students will be required to submit the following by a date yet to be determined. Specific directions and other information will be sent with notification of provisional admission to the program. See ASU Department of Nursing Handbook located on the program website under Student Information.

1. Physical and Safety and Technical Skills Evaluation.
2. Two-step tuberculosis testing.
3. Required immunizations and titers.
4. Criminal Background Check and Drug Screen.
5. Current certificate from the **American Heart Association** Healthcare Provider CPR course. (Card must be valid for a minimum of one year from the beginning of ASU BSN Program courses)
